You have completed a Certificate III or higher through a <u>registered</u> <u>training organisation</u> (this includes TAFEs and private training colleges).

This course has extra requirements, as set by North Metropolitan TAFE.

All applicants are required to attend a mandatory interview with the course coordinator and complete a short literacy assessment. The interview and assessment will take approximately one hour. The interview is an opportunity to discuss what you can expect from the course and what will be expected of you should you be offered a position.

It is recommend that you are over the age of 18 before enrolling in this course, as the fieldwork placement and employment outcomes are very limited for students under the age of 18.

Once you meet the entrance requirements, we put all applicants into a pool, and the strongest applicants are offered a place.

To determine the strongest applicants; TAFE Admissions looks at schooling, completed qualifications and working history.
